Favorite activities: Hula dancing performer, swimming and traveling





Future Plans: My dream is to move to a warm place like Florida or Yuma, Arizona near a body of water. My passion is to be near the water. Traveling and exploring.



Future Plans: Love to travel to different countries and states with friends or groups.







Future Plans: Stay healthy and workouts, have more mini-vacations, love to go to Deaf Seniors of America conferences every two years.








